Secretary Report: was accepted as presented at the Christmas Party.

Executive Report: was reported as the same as before, too

Administrative Report:

Provided the site and time for 16 January's joint meeting with Ponce Inlet members. Location will be Duffs Buffet, 2400 S. Ridgewood Ave., South Daytona, Fl 32119, ph 386-788-0828. Dinner will start at **6pm** and cost will be individually paid at the door with seniors at \$14.92, adults at \$15.77, kids at \$8.73 including meal, drink (non-alcoholic), tax and tip. Wine and beer are available. **Note: To gain entrance to Duffs you must pay for a meal.**

January Piloting Course will be held on Wednesday evenings 7 - 9 P.M. at the Yacht Club training site. This is a 10 week course.

Commander Discussion:

- * Daytona Beach's Boat show is scheduled for 10-12 January 2014, and we need to get the materials ready for this.
- * Marine Max is also planning an open house for 11-12 January.

We need to schedule an ABC following the January Boating Shows. It was recommended to schedule near the end of January, or early February. It was also decided to offer a "Boat Show Special" for attendance, \$38.00 individual, and \$55.00 for couples that share materials.

The IRS is due to respond to our 501.c3 application by the end of December. They have acknowledged receipt of our re-application.

Auxiliary Report:

The Lunch Bunch raised approximately \$156.00, and is presently planning their assistance with the D-23 Winter Council Mtg.

Treasurer's Report:

Due to numerous commitments and expenses, such as, the \$850.00 IRS Application, our operating check book account is only \$1345.51. With additional expenses already planned, it will continue to be drawn down.

As the operating check book account was never reimbursed for the capital investments made in equipping the classroom, a motion was made and passed; "...To reimburse the operating check-book account from the investment account for up to the amount of the costs incurred for the capital improvements for the training facility." Once the receipts are researched for the training facility, the amount transferred will be reported to the membership.

Discussion items:

- * For future pot-lucks the Squadron should consider buying the main course.
- * There are several Squadron positions that some Ponce Inlet members have expressed interest in, such as, VSC coordinator and assistant SEO. Cmdr Bray is coordinating incorporating interested parties into squadron leadership positions.

The Meeting was adjourned at 2055.
